Ward Two Water District is currently repairing a broken water main on the corner of Cane Market Rd and Perkins Rd in Denham Springs Louisiana. While making these repairs, the water pressure will drop below the Louisiana Department of Health minimum standard.

Louisiana Department of Health requires all water systems to do a Boil Advisory if the water pressure goes below the minimum standard.

This Advisory is limited to the following customers: those on Perkins Rd from Rocky Rd to Cane Market Rd and on Cane Market Rd from Perkins Rd to Smylie Rd, including those on Smylie Rd, Cooper Allen Rd, and Perkins Crossing Rd. EXCLUDING: Rocky Rd and Billie Dr

Because of these repairs, the water produced by our water supply system may be of questionable microbiological quality.

Therefore, as a precaution, the Ward Two Water District, water system is issuing a BOIL ADVISORY effective immediately. This BOIL ADVISORY is to remain in effect until rescinded by the Ward Two Water District Water System.

It is recommended that all consumers disinfect their water before consuming it (including fountain drinks), making ice, brushing teeth, or using it for food preparation or rinsing of foods by the following means:

Boil water for one (1) full minute in a clean container. The one-minute starts after the water has been brought to a rolling boil. The flat taste can be eliminated by shaking the water in a clean bottle or pouring it from one clean container to another.

Again, please be sure to disinfect your own water prior to consumption until you have been advised otherwise.

Upon notification from the Office of Public Health's State Regional Laboratory that the samples collected from our water supply have been found to be safe, the State Health Department will notify the water supply of the sample results. Upon such notification, the Ward Two Water District will then rescind the Boil Advisory and notify its customers that the water has been found to be safe.
